The max pressure isn't for maximum performance, it's for maximum weight. Harley manuals assume 180 pounds of rider weight, I believe. So if you're about that, I'd run 30 psi. If you're heavier than that or you're carrying something, I'd run more. I wouldn't run less. And don't run over 40.

Here we get down to ground level and show how to identify what specific psi your tires should be inflated to, and then how to check your current tire pressure. On the Road Glide Special, the recommended tire pressure settings are 36 psi up front, and 40 psi in the rear. You can find this info yourself by checking the sticker on the left-side downtube of the frame.

Check your owners manual for air pressure values and never run the max pressure that is on the sidewall of the tire, unless the load that you are carrying dictates it". If you are using a replacement tire and not the OEM (original equipment manufacturer) tire you may want to check the tire manufactures web site or call us for proper tire inflation. For example if a replacement tire has a load index of "C" and that means the maximum pressure as stated on the sidewall is 50 PSI, but the OEM ...

Digital tyre gauges or tyre inflators/gauge combinations are often more expensive and seem like better quality, but they can lose correct calibration over time and run out of battery. Analog or physical dial gauges are often more accurate for longer.
