Anyone can create a Social Story, as long as they include specific elements when creating the Social Story.

Social stories or picture stories are used to prepare children with autism, Asperger's syndrome or other developmental disorders for new experiences (proactive) or to correct behavioral issues (reactive). Social stories are not just for ASD, children with anxiety or sequencing issues can benefit from them too.

A Social Story can be a written or visual guide describing various social interactions, situations, behaviours, skills or concepts and were first described by Gray and Garand in 1993. They are proposed to work for children with autism due to "theory of mind" and/or "weak central coherence".

Social Stories - Educate Autism

Pioneered by autism specialist Carol Grey, social stories use narrative to help children understand and respond to a range of situations, from joining in playground games to visiting the dentist or going shopping. Each story is unique.
